In March 2020, Uganda shutdown due to the Coronavirus, leaving 15 million students without school. According to The New York Times*:

*51% of the students stopped studying during the shutdown

*30% of the students did not return to school when they reopened in January, 2022.

*Of those that did return many have fallen behind in their studies

Students supported by Reaching Beyond Globally have a different story to tell.

Marianne and Marissa (pictured from our last trip at 4yrs old) fell in love during our first visit. Marissa is now 6 years old and in first grade. They are looking forward to seeing each other when we return in June.

Marianne and Vicki will be returning to Kiryabicooli in June after not being able to travel due to COVID since 2019. During those 2+ years, Reaching Beyond Globally has sponsored and supported 16 students in their Secondary School education. This has included home study when schools were closed, as well as fees when schools re-opened in January, 2022. Upon their return to Uganda Marianne and Vicki will visit the Secondary Schools, meet the head teachers, and see the students in their classes.

*88% continued to study during the shutdown through workbooks, radios, tutors, What'sApp programs, discussion and study groups.

*100% returned to school in January

*All of the students are in the top 25% of their classes
